### Duties and Essential Functions

Job description:

1. Setup and operate a variety of machine tools to machine compressor parts.
2. Calculate dimensions and tolerances with precision measuring instruments (calipers, depth mics, OD mics, ID mics) etc.
3. Machine parts to specifications using machine tools such as manual lathe, manual mill, lapping table, and grinders.
4. Perform disassembly, cleaning, inspection, measuring, reassembly, and testing of valves and packing glands.
5. Work closely and communicate with management, co-workers, and customers to ensure timely and successful completion of jobs.
6. Able to read and understand blueprints and/or drawings.
7. Able to use air tools such as impact gun, cutoff wheels, etc.
8. Need to be very detailed oriented (able to follow processes and procedures)

### Job Requirements

- Level I: 1-2 years' experience as a machinist in a prototype shop environment
